Sunny Learns Sharing

Week 1: Guided Reading story



Guidelines

Before Reading:

Today we'll read about Sunny the snake who learns about sharing.

Listen for the /s/ sound like s-s-snake.

We'll also practice counting to 2!

During Reading:

First read: Track words, emphasize S sounds

Second read: Count "I sock, I cat" together

Third read: Discuss feelings: "Why is Sunny sad? What makes him happy?"

After Reading Discussion Questions:

Phonics Hunt: "Find all the words starting with S

Math Connection: "Count the characters: 1, 2!

Role Play: Act out the story with "sorry" and "sharing"

Real Connection: "When have you shared something?"

Differentiation:

Beginning: Focus on "I am" sentences and counting 1-2

Intermediate: Identify S words and -at rhymes

Advanced: Create new sharing scenarios or write "I can share..."

We Can Share

Sunny Learns to Share



I am Sunny.

I am a snake.

I look around.

By the blue lake.

I see a cat.

She sits on a mat.

She has a snack.

Look at that!

It looks yummy.

It looks sweet.

My tummy rumbles.

I want to eat.

"Wait, Sunny, wait!"

The cat is kind.

"We can share."

"I do not mind!"

We share the snack.

Now I am happy!



Who are the two friends in the story?(Sunny and the Cat)

What did the Cat have on the mat? (A snack/food)

Did Sunny grab the snack, or did he wait? (He waited)

Look at Sunny's face. How do you think he felt when his tummy rumbled?" (Hungry, sad, wanting)

How did the Cat feel about sharing? Was she angry or kind?

(Kind)

How did Sunny feel at the end? Why?" (Happy, because he got to eat and play)

If you had a yummy cookie and your friend looked hungry, what would you do?"

What is your favorite toy? Who can you share it with?

Lets Talk about it

Planit Play Tip for Parents:

When Sunny waits (instead of grabbing the snack), point it out! Say, "Wow, look at Sunny waiting! That is very hard to do when you are hungry." This teaches your child about Impulse Control—a key skill for school readiness!
